# Group Program Focus

- Pre-teen, teens and young adults who have the ability to participate in a group environment and who present with deficits in social skills.
- Clients must be able to function in a group without 1:1 support.
- The group can be used as a transition out of 1:1 ABA or be client's initial and stand-alone treatment modality.

**FAQ:** Can a client have a paraprofessional to help with transition into the group?

- **Yes** - a paraprofessional can attend with a client who needs help during the transition to group.
- **When this is case you bill at the paraprofessional level and don't bill for the group.**
- This is considered 1:1 ABA that happens to be in a group setting.
- If H2019 hours are needed and not authorized, please submit an addendum prior to providing H2019 hours

# Primary Facilitator Must Be

# Secondary Facilitator

Secondary or additional practitioners may be added as needed; However, one facilitator must meet the qualifications on slide 5. Paraprofessionals (RBTs) can fill the role of the secondary facilitator

Examples:

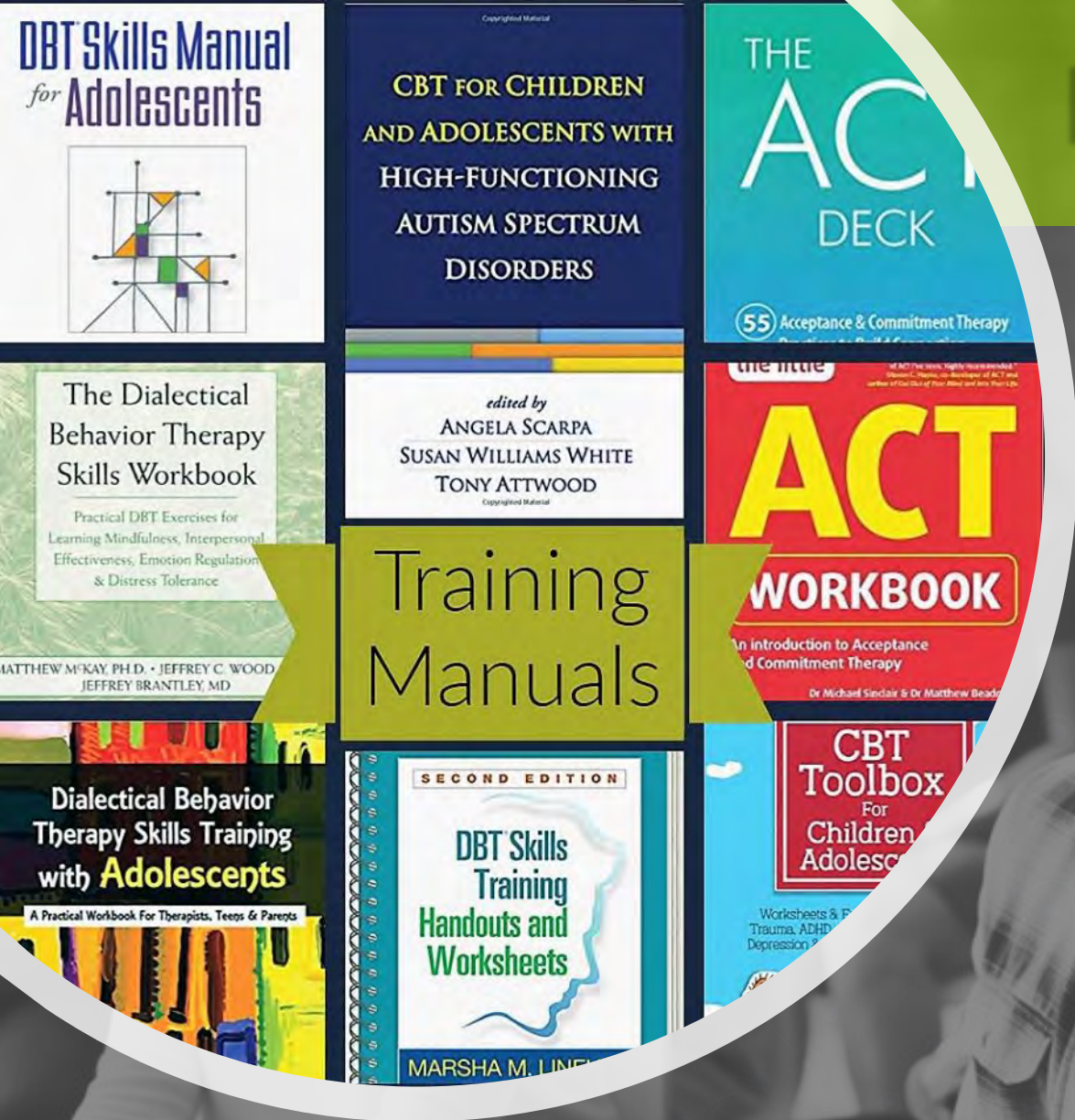
- A 6-8 client group could be facilitated by a BCaBA and an RBT
- A group of 5 clients could be facilitated by a LCSW and an RBT

**FAQ:** Do all participants in the social skills group need to be BHPN clients?

- **No-** not all clients in the group need to be BHPN clients, but if there is even one BHPN client in the group the group must meet the BHPN guidelines

# Modalities and Training

- Modalities include: ABA, ACT, DBT, and CBT
- For non-ABA social skills group, the mid- or high-level facilitators must have training in the modality. Training in the modality may be online, in-person, or with a training manual and mentor.

**FAQ:** If ACT can be used for group why doesn't the BHPN allow ACT for 1:1 treatment?

- The BHPN conducted a literature review, collaborated with several BCBAs with knowledge about ACT, consulted the Provider Advisory Committee, and discussed with Kaiser.
- The conclusions from this examination is that ACT is a psychotherapy model and there is insufficient empirical evidence for ACT's use in 1:1 treatment for ASD.
- There is modest evidence using ACT materials for group treatment as long as it is within the scope of the primary facilitator.
- For these reasons currently the BHPN allows ACT only for group treatment.

# Location: Clinic or Center, or Telehealth

- You must have drop off and pick up sign in procedure as well as emergency procedures for elopement (client under 18 years).
- The BHPN can provide you with sample procedures for pick up, drop off etc.
- The BHPN's Office of Risk Management may review these procedure during regular audits.
- Groups cannot be held in the community.



# Group Ratios & Hours

Max ratio: 4:1

Max group size: 8 clients

Frequency: Maximum 2 groups per week per client

Hours: Maximum 4 hours a week

Open groups: So that clients can start any week



# Why Open Groups?

Open groups are important because clients and families don't want to wait.

The BHPN can consult with you around operational steps for open groups



# Supervision

Client receives 1:1 ABA & group: ABA supervision for group should be rolled into the supervision for 1:1 ABA

Client receives group only, 2 hours CM supervision allotted

# Supervision

Client receives 1:1 ABA & group: ABA supervision for group should be rolled into the supervision for 1:1 ABA

Client receives group only: 2 hours CM supervision allotted

# Placement

The BHPN will determine during the BHPN Initial Assessment which new clients are appropriate for Social Skills Group treatment.

- You will see these clients on the list as “Social Skills Group.”
- You will receive a Social Skills Group Assessment authorization for these clients. This assessment can be completed by telehealth in one session.

You may recommend Social Skills Group for a client who has been receiving 1:1 ABA and is ready to transition to group.

- No assessment is needed as you have already been treating the client and have already made the determination that they are ready for group.

You may receive a client who is transferring from a provider who doesn't have a group program. The client may have discharged from the 1:1 episode of ABA and be ready for group or may be still receiving some 1:1 ABA.

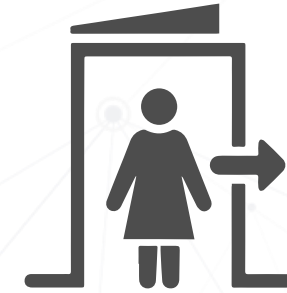
- You will receive a Social Skills Group Assessment authorization for these clients as they are new to you.

Use the BHPN Discharge Guidelines

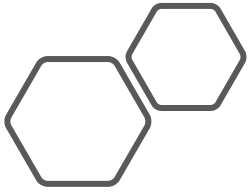


# The BHPN Can Help
